

Induction Programme

Considering the large number of female students and their academic schedules, the Women Development Cell (WDC) of the College organized two separate induction programmes on 23rd July and 8th August 2025.

The primary objective of these sessions was to formally introduce the WDC, its objectives, and its support mechanisms to the newly enrolled girl students. The programmes aimed to create awareness about the Cell's role in promoting safety, empowerment, and gender sensitization within the campus environment.

During the sessions, the committee members briefed the students about the objectives and functions of the Women Development Cell. The students were informed that they are welcome to approach any female teaching staff member at any time if they require guidance, support, or assistance.

The committee also provided important safety guidelines. Female students were advised to remain vigilant, particularly when alone in public places. They were cautioned against accepting lifts from strangers and consuming food or beverages offered by unknown individuals at social gatherings. Students were encouraged to maintain open communication with their parents or guardians, especially if they ever feel unsafe.

Additional safety measures were discussed, and the committee highlighted various awareness programmes organized by the WDC on topics such as domestic violence, sexual harassment, gender equality, gender sensitization, and self-Defence.

The sessions aimed to instill a sense of confidence and reassurance among the students, emphasizing that the College is fully committed to ensuring their safety, dignity, and overall well-being.

Several female students voluntarily registered themselves as student representatives of the Women Development Cell.
